Important Covid-19 Information

Dear Parent/Carer

Rising COVID cases in school

Due to the rising numbers of COVID cases within school, we have decided to take the additional measure of asking parents to keep children at home if ANYBODY in their household has tested positive for COVID on a LFD or a PCR. This is to reduce the transmission of the virus and keep both children and staff safe as much as possible.

Remote education will be provided for all children who need to remain at home.

Whilst at home:

- Parents and children over 5 in the household need to take a LFD test each day for 7 days.
- If ALL members of the household are negative on day 6 and 7 (24 hours apart) your child/ren will be able to return to school on day 8. Results MUST be emailed to covid@chps.paymat.org before your child can return to school.
- If ANYONE in the household is still positive on day 6 and or 7 you must continue to stay at home and test again on day 7 and 8, if both test results are negative your child/ren can return to school on day 9.
- If ANYONE in the household is still positive on day 7 and or 8 you must continue to stay at home and test again on day 8 and 9, if both test results are negative your child/ren can return to school on day 10
- If you have not had a negative test result, you are to isolate until day 10. Your child/ren can return to school on day 11 as long as they don't have a high temperature.



Further NEW guidance from the Government that will come in place from 11 January 2022.

From 11 January anyone in England who receives a **positive lateral flow device (LFD)** result should report their result on gov.uk and must self-isolate immediately and will **no longer need to confirm it with a PCR if they do not have symptoms**.

People with the three official Covid symptoms - high temperature, a new continuous cough and loss of taste or smell **MUST still get a PCR**.

Other symptoms to look out for:

- a runny nose
- headache
- fatigue
- sneezing
- sore throat
