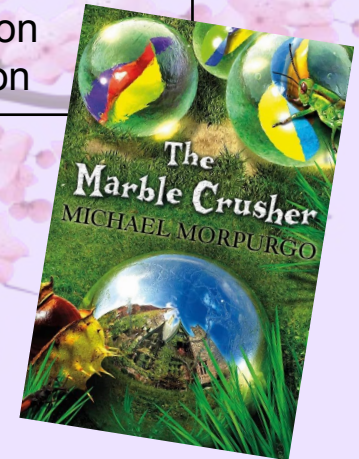
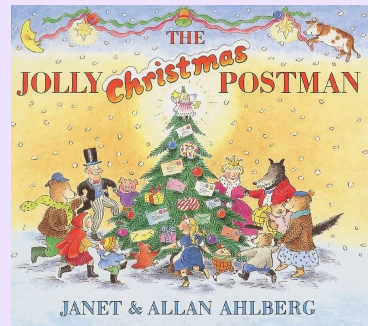
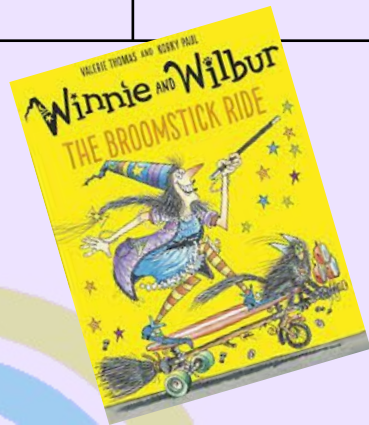

Early use of digital technology has been shown to improve language skills and promote children's social development and creativity. However, it's not without risks for young children.

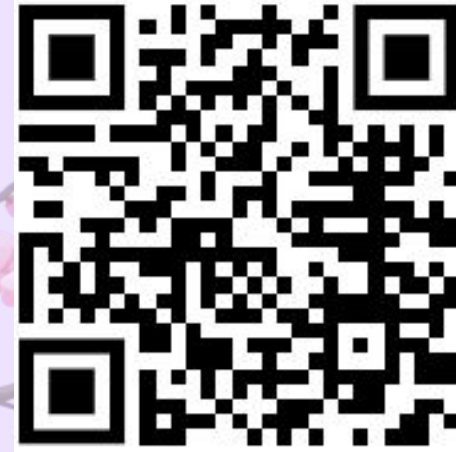

We appreciate that you are trusting us with your child: we want parents and carers to feel welcome and know who you can speak to if they have any questions or concerns.

- **Class Teacher** - support staff are happy to pass messages on to the class teacher in the mornings. Alternatively, ask them to ask the teacher to give you a call when they can, or speak to them at the end of the day
- **Assistant Head** for your child's phase, if you are not satisfied with the class teachers response
- **Deputy Head**, if you need further discussion
- **Headteacher** if you are still not satisfied and have been through all other channels of communication

Meet the Trust

You are invited into school on Wednesday 1st November at 2:30pm to meet some key members of staff from the Central Trust Team. They will be able to share with you the structure of the Trusts central services and how the work of the central team supports Crossley Hall.

They will also explain how you can raise issues about your child/ren's welfare and education, and then work with the Central Team to address any concerns.

Further to this we would like to offer our support to any parents or carers that may be struggling to access the Arbor App or ParentPay. We are a paperless and cashless school so it is essential that you have access to both of these services. Mrs Holroyd (our Family Liaison Officer) will be on hand from 2pm if you require any assistance.



Did you know...

Being 5 minutes late every day equals 3 days of lost learning every year

Being 15 minutes late every day equals two weeks of lost learning every year

11 days off school equals 94% attendance and 66 hours of lost learning

19 days off school equals 90% attendance - your child is classed as a persistent absentee and will lose 114 hours of lost learning
