



Children learn and develop more from birth to five years than my other time in their lives and any gaps in their learning by the nd of the Early Years will, on average, double by the end of the primary years.

Good Habits

here are many benefits to good attendance. It builds in children the idea that getting up and going to school is simply what you does something lety will take into their adult life to when it comes to work. Children who attend regularly gain a sense of security from the regular courins. Unfortunately, underschievement is inked to lower attendance. Establishing good habits early is the key to futuresuccess.

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Self Exteem

Children who rarely miss sessions at Nurserylschool and arrive on time are more likely to feel good about themselves and be conflident when arriving at school. Children who arrive late or regularly miss sessions, can feel a sense of uneasiness or feel they need to try a bit harder to understand what is going on or what other children are talking about or doing.

Punctuality

very disruptive for your child, their teacher, the other children in their class and their education. Aeriving late everyday means your child will miss all their phonics lessons which will ultimately impact their reading and writing. It is important that children understand the importance of time keeping as a life skill too.
