

# Sentence Writing

### Phonics Games

Children's knowledge of sounds and letters can be practised regularly through games. Here are a few examples:

- Play I Spy: Play the game by saying the sound that the word starts with. 'I spy with my little eye something starting with 'c' (cat)
- Fred I spy: Sound the word out using Fred Talk for the children to then blend. 'I spy something rie d.
- Spot words while out shopping and ask children to identify the sounds.

### Letter Formation

In Early Years, there is a continuous focus on developing children's gross and fine motor skills in order to prepare them for writing. Once children have developed strength in their hands, they are able to grip a pencil holding the tripod grip and form letters. Letter formation works best if your child practises for a short time everyday.

# EYFS

### Phonics in Early Years

Crossley Hall Primary follow the Read, Write, Ink Scheme (RWI) to support the teaching of Reading and Writing.

RWI lessons involve children learning the letter sounds in a set order and every lesson starts with 'speed sounds' where child dren read the sounds learnt as quickly as they can. A frog called 'Fred' is used to help children learn the sounds, segment (split the sounds) and sound them out.

Once children can identify single so unds, they move onto 'blending'. This means putting so unds together to make a word c a t = cat

Once children are able to blend and segment, this provides a firm foundation for children to be able to read and write.

We strongly recommend that you read with your child every

day and develop a love of reading and stories as studies have shown that good readers make good writers

### Sentence Games

Children's learning develops quickly in the Early Years. For example, once Phonics is being taught regularly in Reception, you will suddenly find children are reading and writing independently!

Games are a fun way to get children writing. This can be done by using a visual stimulus like a picture or a scene or even a real life experience. You could also use some key words like 'dog', 'the', 'fish' and ask your child to think of a sentence with the word in and write it down.

### Making and Writing Sentences

In RWI sessions, children 'hold a sentence' and then have a go at writing it in their books. This involves, hearing a sentence, remembering it and then writing it down—three very important skills. In provision, we provide children with ample opportunities to write and apply the skill of 'holding the sentence' so they know what to write.


Sentence writing at home can involve asking children to write what they would like to do on the weekend, recount what they have done, write what they would like for their birthday or write about their day in school.

Encourage your child to think about what they want to write, identify what sound the word starts with and what other sounds they can hear in the word while they are writing it.

Remember to stay positive and, even if they make mistakes, do not discourage them. Instead, support them in self-correcting or gives clues such as, "What word have you missed out?" or "What sound does dog start with?"

Remind children about:

\*Capital Letters at the start \*Finder spaces between words \*Full stop or punctuation at the end of the sentence


Class Teachers come down to Reception to spend time with children allocated to their class.



# Did you know...
