When will the check take place?



Information

The multiplication tables check (MTC) is statutory for all year 4 pupils registered at state-funded maintained schools, special schools or academies, including free schools, in England.

The purpose of the MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will help schools to identify pupils who have not yet mastered their times tables, so that additional support can be provided. The Department for Education also publishes statistics on MTC attainment.

In 2025, schools must administer the MTC to all eligible year 4 pupils between Monday 2 June and Friday 13 June.

Schools can use the following week, Monday 16 June to Friday 20 June, to administer the check to any pupils who were absent during the first 2 weeks or in case of any delays to the administration of the check due to technical difficulties.

Schools must provide a reason within the MTC service for any pupils who are not able to participate in the check.

- Using familiar class chromebooks
- 25 questions
- 6 seconds per question
- Typed answers
- Small group setting
- Familiar adult

What are we doing at school?



- Daily whole-class times tables practice using 'Daily ten'
- Individual testing of times tables depending on the times table they are working on (linked to display)
- Encouraging children to ask adults to test their fluency (rapid recall)
- Making links to other times tables previously learned
- Encouraging times tables to be completed at home for just five minutes per day.


